When a child becomes ill in school, the student will be referred to the School Nurse. In the event that the nurse is unavailable, the student will be referred to the Principal.

<u>Under no circumstances should a child use their cell phone to call or text a parent to come pick them up.</u> Students who do this will not be dismissed. Please adhere to this policy.

EMERGENCY FORM, and

the pick-up person must have a valid photo ID.

A child will be dismissed if he/she:

Vomits

Has a temperature of 100.4 or greater

Has diarrhea

Has persistent abdominal discomfort

Has a persistent headache

Has persistent pain anywhere, with or without impaired mobility.

Has a **severe** cold, cough, sneezing, sore throat, or red watery eyes.

Has suspicious skin eruptions or rashes not readily identified. These should be considered contagious and

Has untreated pink eye/red crusting eye, until a note is presented from the physician that states the student has been treated for at least 24 hours and has been cleared to return to school.

DISPENSING MEDICINE IN SCHOOL

Any student who is to take medication during school hours must have the following form completed and returned to the School Nurse-Teacher.

All medication must be dispensed by the School Nurse-Teacher, except for older students and students with asthma, who are capable of self-medication with the written permission of both parent and physician.
